PREFACE

This booklet is a pre-primer alphabet picture book to be used to teach the alphabet prior to the use of Primer 1, Agbasa Kuy.

The letters of the alphabet are symbolized as follows: a, b, k, d, e, g, h, i, l, m, n, ng, p, s, t, u, w, y. In proper names the following additional symbols are being introduced in this booklet: c, f, j, o, r, v.

The glottal stop is indicated by a grave accent (`), when it occurs at the end of a word or at the end of a syllable that is followed by a consonant in the middle of a word (as in talètè 'lizard').

TO THE TEACHER

This booklet has been constructed to help teach a Binukid speaking pupil the alphabet in his dialect.

Each picture represents a word which begins with the letter being taught. Beneath the picture are both the lower case and capital letters.

The pronunciation of the symbol e, which is not found in Cebuano, is similar to the e in Pangasinan, or to the English pronunciation of the oo in the word 'book' (except that the lips are unrounded as when one smiles). The Binukid word ekang 'owl' is used to illustrate this vowel.

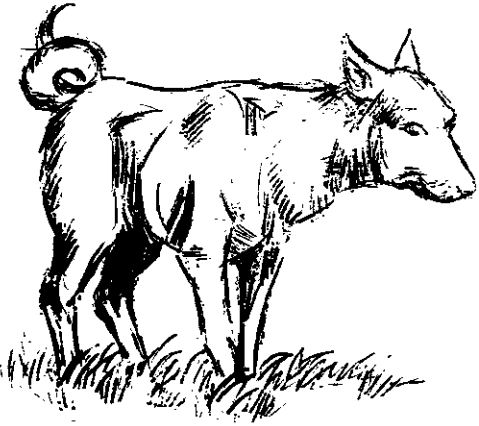
On the drill page for each lesson there are two letters in a divided box at the end of a line. The pupil should be able to find the same letters in the row preceding each box before going on to the next lesson. In some drills the capital letters are mixed in with the lower case letters to help train the pupil to recognize the differences. This is just one method suggested for testing the pupils. The teacher may choose other methods of testing.

At the end of Lesson 6 there are two review pages. The pupil should be able to read or to point out any of the letters on the review pages before proceeding to the final test page.

On the test page are various shaped boxes. The teacher should dictate a letter and request the pupils to write the lower case form of that letter in one half of the box and the capital form of the same letter in the remaining half of the box.

When a pupil has successfully completed this booklet he is then ready to proceed to Primer 1, Agbasa Kuy 1.

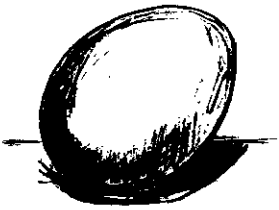
