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### Preface

There have been 2 previous Dobu dictionaries published before this one—an extensive and comprehensive one done by the Rev. J. Dixon and a school dictionary put out by the Rev. R.V. Grant. This dictionary in its present form relies heavily on that of Rev. R.V. Grant whose work and that of Rev. J. Dickson are gratefully acknowledged.

Dobu has been written since 1891 and there have been various changes in spelling since then. This present dictionary in its 3rd edition, is an attempt to standardize modern spelling. Letters used in writing Dobu are:

‘ (glottal), a, b, bw, d, e, g, gw, i, k, kw, l, m, mw, n, o, p, pw, s, t, u, w, y.

We no longer use r, as l and r are variations of the same sound in Dobu.

The glottal, written ‘, is not a letter in English, but it is in Dobu, replacing k in one dialect of Dobu and in neighbouring languages. It is a very important letter as there are many pairs of words in Dobu, different in meaning, where the only difference in spelling is the glottal.

So it is important to know where the glottal is in words and to always write it. In spelling aloud, it is good to say *sa’e* as *s-a-glottal-e*. This makes us remember the glottal as a letter and where it is in a word.

Because people are often unsure whether there is a glottal at the beginning of a word or not, this dictionary lists words beginning with a glottal before those without. e.g. ‘*a*, then *a, b, bw, d, e, e*, etc.

In Dobu there are a number of words traditionally spelt with ‘*oa* and ‘*oe*.

In this dictionary they are spelt as ‘*w* to follow the pattern where glottal replaces the *k*.

For ‘*oa* and ‘*oe* words see ‘*wa* and ‘*we* in the dictionary.

Consonants are pronounced approximately as in English, except that I is an alveolar flap.

o as in English <b>port</b>
